Blockwise Quarterly Report

July 1 - September 30, 2023



Methodology

- **6,236 respondents** were recruited online between July 1st and September 30th, 2023, using targeted ads on various platforms (e.g., social media) as well as via online survey panels.
- Zencity's survey methods achieves representation at the city level by matching respondent data to the U.S. Census Bureau's race, ethnicity (Hispanic/Latino origin), age, and gender distributions in Harris County.
- Rake-weighting was applied as a statistical safeguard to balance out any remaining discrepancies in distribution so no demographic group is overrepresented or underrepresented in the final score.

Report Structure

- For each district and the countywide level, the report first provides an overview of the overall scores, covering four key measures: Safety, Fairness, Respect, and Voice, with a demographic breakdown for each and a presentation of the scores over time. The measure scores are an average of between one and three questions. The questions included in each measure are listed below.
- For the countywide level, the report also **compares Harris County's scores** to the **national benchmark survey and a cohort of similar communities** based on demographics from the Census Bureau.
- The report then presents the top concerns raised by respondents in the following open-text question:
 What is the number one issue or problem in your local District that you would like the police to deal with?

Measure Questions

1. Safety:

a. When it comes to the threat of crime, how safe do you feel in your neighborhood?

2. Fairness:

- a. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement? In general, the police in my area treat everyone fairly regardless of who they are.
- b. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement? In general, the police in my area provide the same quality of service to all individuals.

3. Respect:

- a. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement? In general, the police in my area would treat you with respect if you had contact with them for any reason.
- b. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement? In general, the police in my area treat local residents with respect.

4. Voice:

- a. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement? In general, the police in my area are approachable.
- b. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement? In general, the police in my area listen to and take into account the concerns of local residents.
- c. How willing would you be to contact the Police Department if you were a victim of a crime or were worried about something?






National Benchmark Surveys. The National Benchmark Blockwise Survey is conducted twice per year and surveys over 6000 residents across the country in over 1000 communities. The survey content for each matches the same questionnaires we administer to our client communities. **The national scores are adjusted for your demographics**, to give a sense of what the scores would look like if the whole country looked like your community. By making these adjustments, we minimize differences between the national score and your score that's based solely on demographics.

Cohorts. To provide information to our clients on how residents in similar communities feel, we create a score at the "cohort" level. A cohort is a group of similar communities, based on demographics from the Census Bureau, including population density, age distribution, race/ethnicity distribution, gender, and median income. By using this approach rather than focusing just on size or geographic area, the cohorts are more relevant for each client.

Your cohort group included the following communities: Los Angeles County, CA; Cook County, IL; New York County, NY; Kings County, NY; Maricopa County, AZ; Queens County, NY; Clark County, NV; San Diego County, CA; King County, WA.





Top Safety Concerns — District 4/West District
















